## OFF DUTY POLICE RELATED SITUATIONS HANDLED

4 in the village and 5 in the township - 9 TOTAL

10/5 - Subjects broke into the Concord DPW vehicle shop on N. Main St as well as the laundromat and a storage facility. The only thing taken was some meat from the DPW shop and the only video systems in the area didn't produce anything of note. It also appears, on that same night, subjects attempted to cut off the catalytic converters on several trucks at the feed mill, but were unsuccessful.



10/9 - A shirtless man at the Dollar General store became irate when he was told he had to have a shirt on to enter the property. He was 'kindly' asked to take his business elsewhere. (And also to not be an idiot.)



10/11 - I assisted another county deputy in apprehending a catalytic converter thief in the parking lot of Caster Concepts in Parma. He was caught red-handed, with the saw, but continued to deny involvement. While he was taken into custody, I searched the area and located his vehicle in a woods nearby and inside the vehicle was his girlfriend, who he had seriously assaulted. He was arrested on a bevy of felony charges.



10/12 - A delivery van was struck by a stray bullet while driving southbound on Wheeler Rd. Nothing further and no one was injured.



10/16 - On this date, five catalytic converter thieves were caught red-handed countywide and it is not believed any of them are related. Later this evening, additional converters were cut off 4 vehicles at Spring Arbor University.



10/19- A subject in the village fell for a Best Buy 'we charged your account' scheme and contacted the number provided in an e-mail. That number was also part of the scam and the hackers accessed her personal savings account and attempted to steal \$17,000 from her. Luckily, her bank was able to intercept the transfer and she didn't lose anything. These scammers/hackers are slick!



10/20 - I assisted units in Sandstone Township on a heroin overdose.



10/22 - The school reported someone had stolen some landscaping stones from school grounds and a photograph of the suspect's vehicle was provided. The suspect, a village resident, claimed that - by paying her taxes - she was okay to take the stones. There is no arguing with this level of complete stupidity. The subject has pledged to return the stones.



10/22 - I arrested a subject for trespassing and a bond violation at a village residence on S. Main St.



10/23 - I handled a car v. deer crash on River St. near Coxon St.



10/27 - A gaggle of local youths have been banned from the Dollar General for petty theft and acting like buffoons. Their parents have been notified.
